



# Enhanced Recovery After Surgery

This course explained the concept of the Enhanced Recovery Programme. It discussed the pre- and post-operative protocols around surgery and provided an understanding of the principles of anaesthesia and pain relief post-operatively on the ward. It highlighted the importance of minimally invasive surgery and discussed peri-operative management on the ward. Additionally, it discussed fluid management on the ward and focussed on discharge planning.
