Essential Surgical Skills and Principles for Aspiring Surgeons (ESSPAS)

This one-day course aimed to provide the delegate with an overview of the essential principles, core concepts and fundamental skills relevant for early surgical training. The course predominantly comprised of hands-on training in surgical skills using animal tissue interspersed with structured and focused teaching on the principles of management of trauma and operative surgery. With a high tutor-to-delegate ratio, this course was designed to equip the delegate with the essential surgical skills that will be expected of a clinical medical student or junior doctor in the operating theatre. There were also discussions on the management of patients with trauma and those presenting with surgical emergencies.

Topics Covered:

- o Aseptic precautions
- o Suture materials and needles
- o Safe use of local anaesthesia
- o Surgical instrument handling
- o Secure knot tying
- Basic suturing techniques (simple interrupted; simple continuous; subcuticular; vertical mattress; and horizontal mattress)
- o Excision of a lesion
- o Drainage of an abscess
- o Wound debridement
- o Role of antibiotics in trauma and surgery
- o Principles of diathermy
- o Wound healing and principles of reconstructive surgery
- o Discussion of cases in trauma and general surgery


Aseptic Precautions in the Operating Theatre






Suturing a Linear Wound (Simple Interrupted and Simple Continuous)




Safe Use of Diathermy









