Key Skills for Urology Trainees

This course aimed to provide delegates with the opportunity to practice and enhance their urological skills on animal tissue and dry models. Early year surgical trainees often have limited exposure and opportunity to learn basic urology skills. This course therefore intended to increase confidence and encourage the effective execution of routine urological procedures.

Delegates received supervision from consultants and learnt how to successfully perform hydrocele repair and scrotal exploration +/- fixation on specially prepared animal testicles, as well as circumcision and suprapubic catheters on plastic models. The day consisted of a variety of skills workshops interspersed with lectures which covered the management of urological emergencies and routine outpatient urology. The ways in which to competently use a bladder scan were also explored.

Aims:

To equip surgical trainees with the skills required for safe scrotal surgery using animal tissue and dry specimens.

To ensure that on-call surgical FY2s and CT2s are competent in the management of acute urological emergencies.

To improve the confidence of delegates when managing patients in both an inpatient and outpatient setting.







How would you rate the general academic standard of the tutors?








Hydrocele Repair (Lords, Jabulay)




Circumcision











SPC Catheterisation and Vasectomy


