COURSE FORMAT AND CONTENT

- The course will consist of small group and individual vivas.
- You will have the opportunity to participate in one-on-one vivas, as in the exam.
- Slides of images and pathology specimens will be shown, and you will be asked common examination questions.
- Real patients with pathologies will be available for the clinical component of the course.
- Emphasis will be laid on all participants to answer questions. Each participant will be given time to hone their discussion skills with an examiner and to present the findings confidently.
- All the viva stations will be covered in detail: Emergency Surgery (including trauma) and Critical Care;

General Surgery; Declared Specialty (Upper and Lower GI; Hepatobiliary and Pancreatic Surgery; Endocrine; Breast; Transplant); General Surgery of Childhood; and Academic Viva.
