











# BSMS Homelessness Conference: Shining a Light on Homelessness

The rate of homelessness has increased dramatically in recent years resulting in a huge strain on the NHS, social services and the housing sector. It has a huge impact on those affected, with significantly higher incidences of mental and physical health problems amongst the homeless and rough sleepers. The conference aimed to address the following questions: Why have the incidences of homelessness increased? Why does rough sleeping affect peoples' health so negatively? How can we help?

The first BSMS Homelessness Conference explored the reasons why and how people become homeless, the chief concerns of those working in homelessness and why health should be the main priority. This conference served as an introduction to homelessness and its surrounding issues including drug and alcohol abuse, domestic abuse and refugees.

The conference was hosted by BSMS HoMed. BSMS HoMed is Brighton and Sussex Medical School's Homeless Medicine Society, which aims to improve healthcare for homeless people and other vulnerable groups by improving the understanding and skills of future doctors. The society hopes to achieve this through educational events, volunteering and fundraising.







# How would you rate the general academic standard of the speakers?










Workshop 7 - Mr Simon Hughes: Homelessness Services - Improving




Workshop 8 - Ms Harriet Beeching: High Intensity Users - MDT Care for Adults With Complex Needs Presenting to A&E




Please rate your understanding of the issues surrounding homelessness and related factors BEFORE you attended the conference.




Please rate your understanding of the issues surrounding homelessness and related factors AFTER you attended the conference.




Do you think medical schools should include more education surrounding homelessness and inclusion health in their curriculum?









