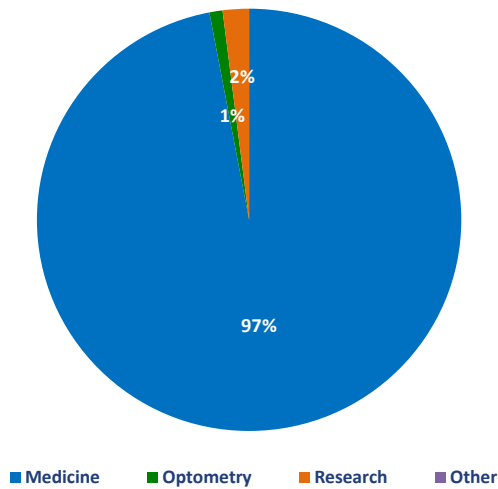

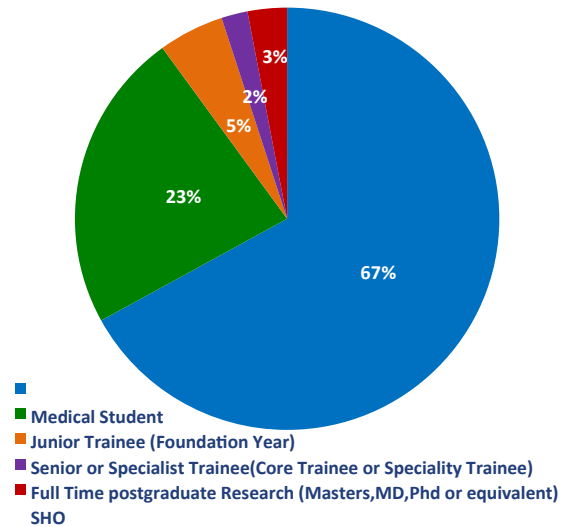

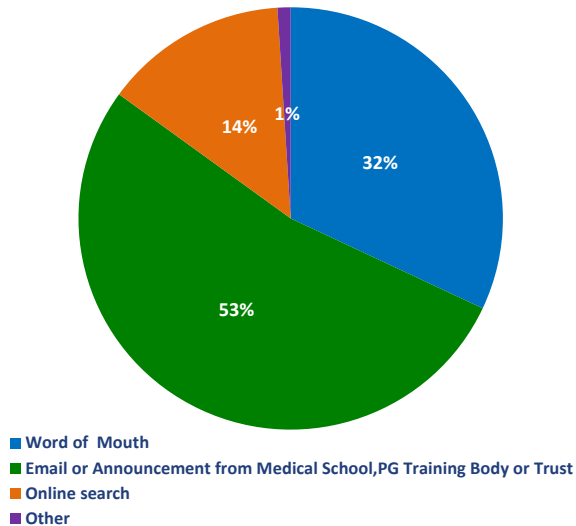
To which profession do you belong?



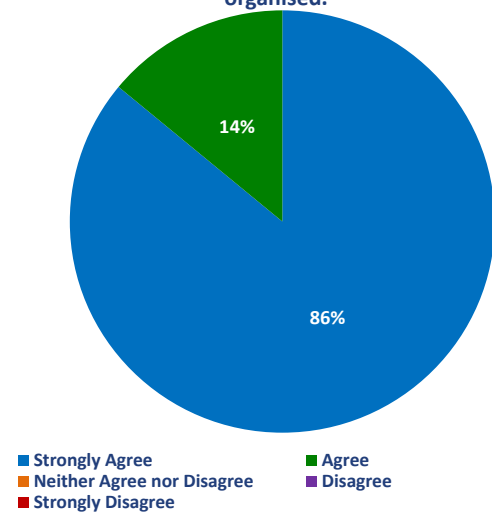
What level are you currently at?



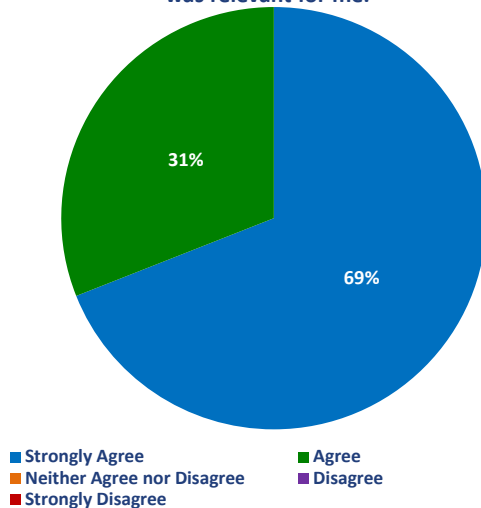

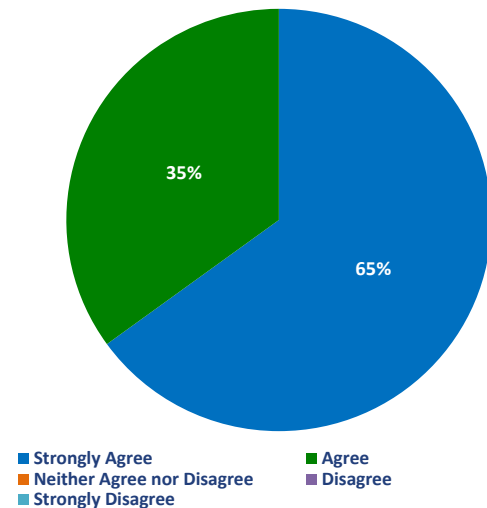
