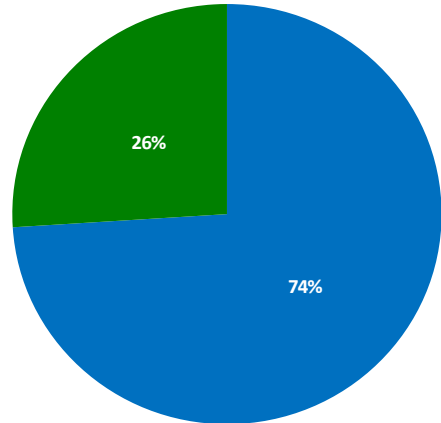

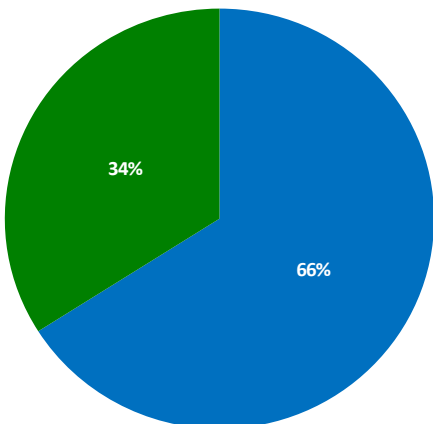

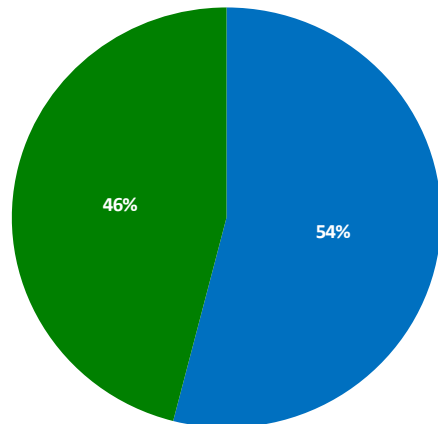

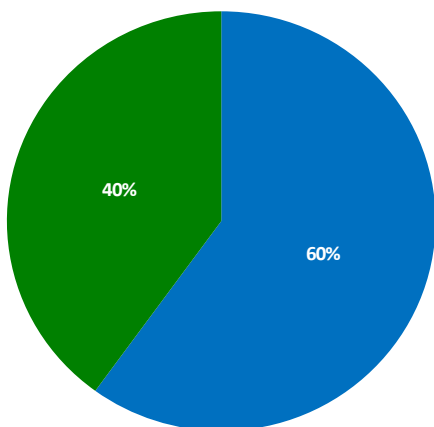

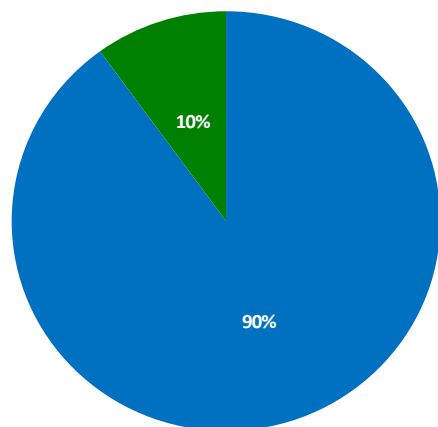

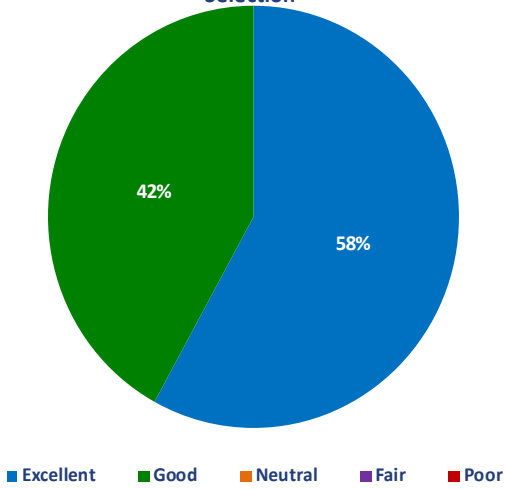
Periprosthetic Fractures Around Hips



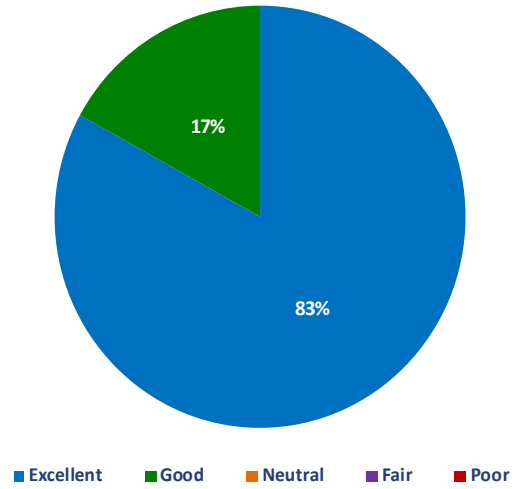

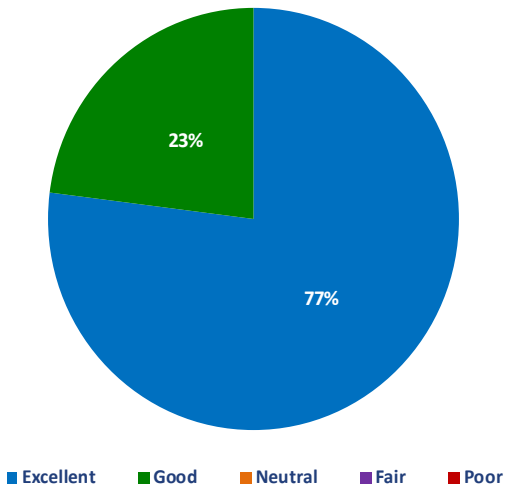

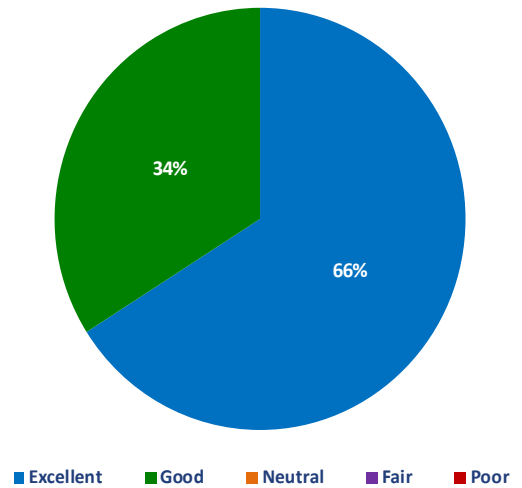
Supracondylar Fractures in Children



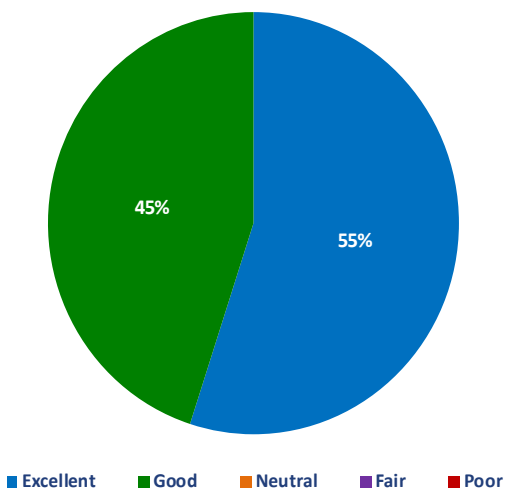
Paediatric Femoral Fractures



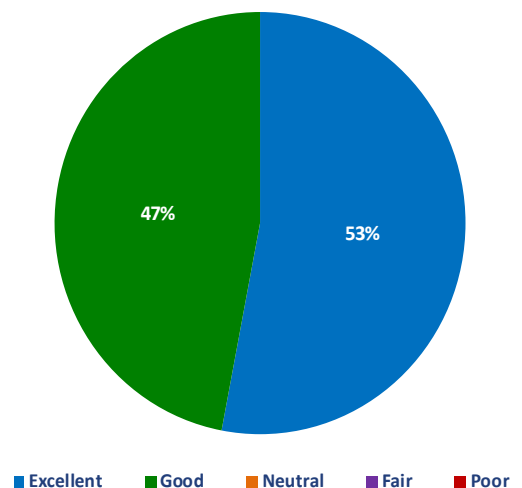
Difficult Tibial Fractures



Tibial Plateau Fractures

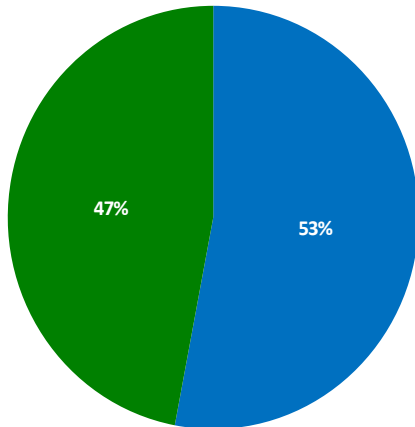

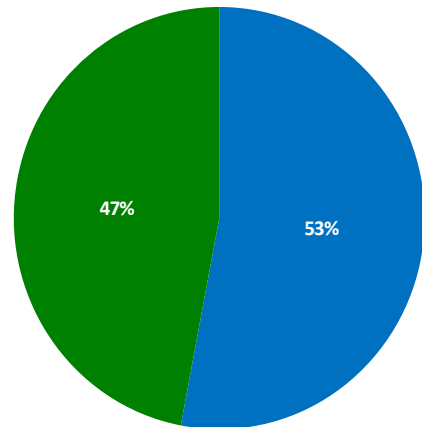

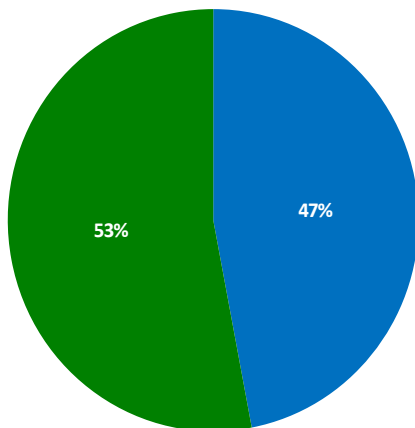

Complex Elbow Fractures



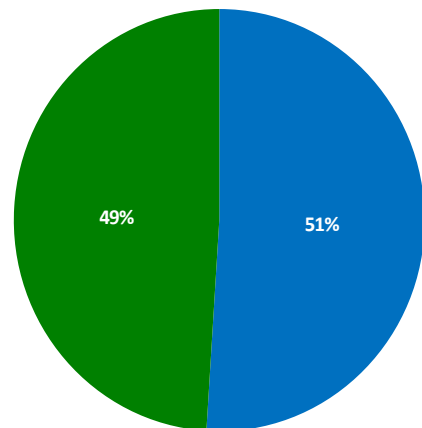

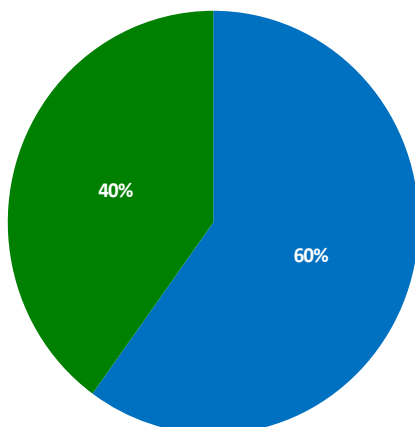

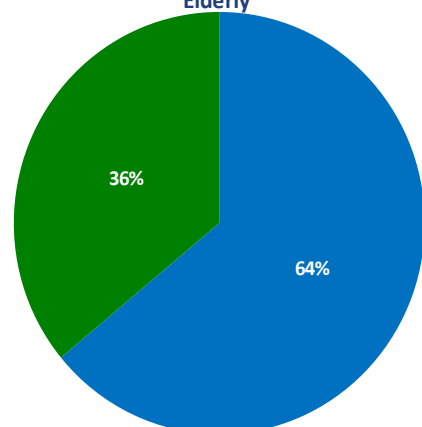

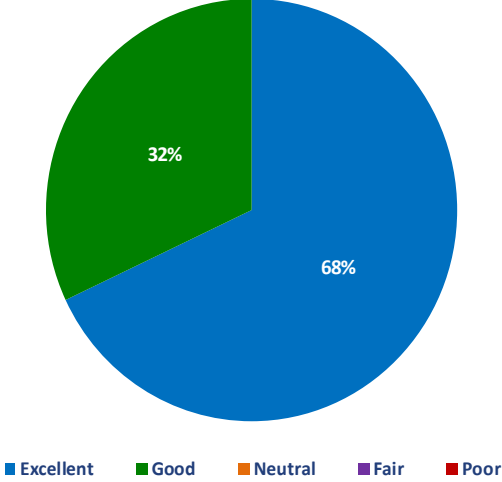
Management of Pelvic Ring Injuries in the Elderly



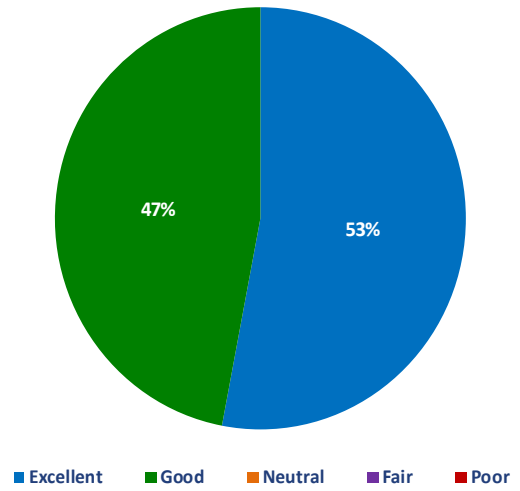

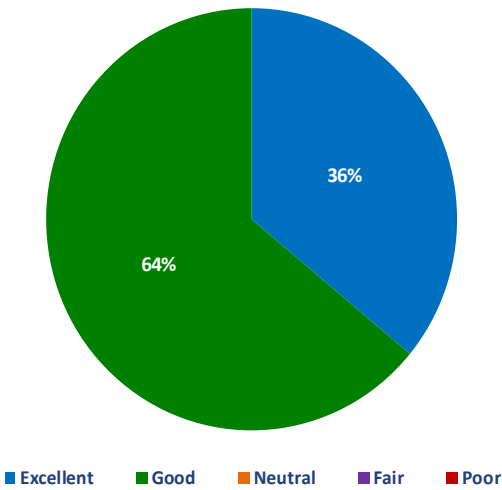
Management of Acetabular Fractures in the Elderly



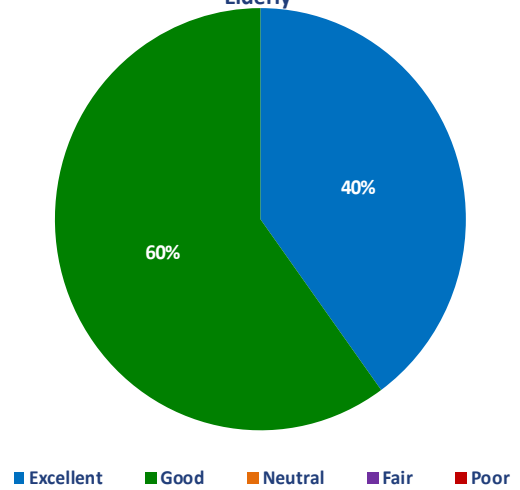
Upper Limb Fractures in the Frail



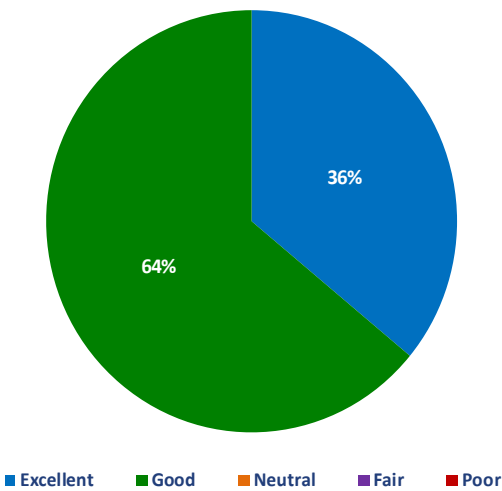

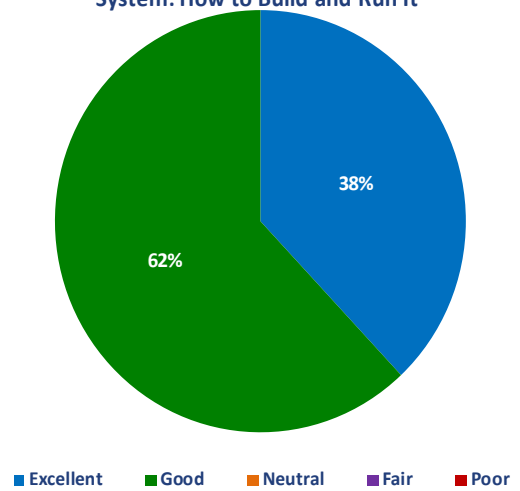

NHFD and Cardiff Hip Fracture Pathway

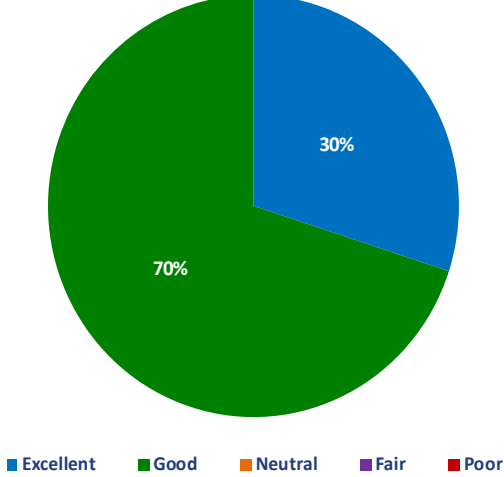

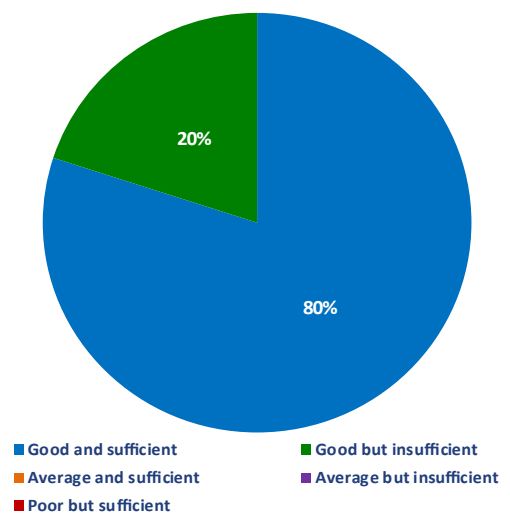

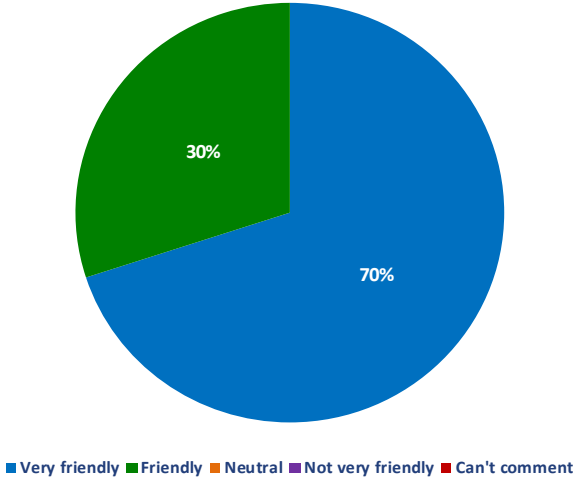
