- The course will consist of small group and individual vivas.
- You will have the opportunity to participate in one-on-one vivas, as in the exam.
- Slides of images and pathology specimens will be shown, and you will be asked common examination questions.
- Real patients with pathologies will be available for the clinical component of the course.
- Emphasis will be laid on all participants to answer questions. Each participant will be given time to hone their discussion skills with an examiner and to present the findings confidently.
- All the viva stations will be covered in detail: Emergency Surgery (including trauma) and Critical Care; General Surgery; Declared Specialty (Upper and Lower GI; Hepatobiliary and Pancreatic Surgery; Endocrine; Breast; Transplant); General Surgery; and Academic Viva.

A complimentary course dinner has been arranged for all delegates and faculty in one of the local restaurants on the evening of Saturday 25th July at 1830 hours. You are cordially invited to attend.
