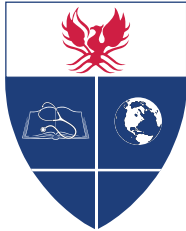

Key Concepts in the Assessment and Management of Gastrointestinal Diseases in Secondary Care Medicine

Gastrointestinal conditions and disorders are common in clinical practice. Patients present with a wide range of conditions, such as upper GI bleeds, portal hypertension, peptic ulcer disease, GORD, inflammatory bowel diseases, and bowel obstructions.

This talk covered the assessment and management of commonly encountered gastroenterology scenarios, such as acute flare ups of inflammatory bowel diseases, peptic ulcers, and upper GI bleeds.

Aims:

- o To improve the attendee's confidence in the management of commonly encountered gastrointestinal pathologies in secondary care.
- o To provide a revision resource for the pathophysiology of gastrointestinal diseases and the rationale for subsequent management.
- o To briefly outline the key concepts of requesting common gastroenterology investigations, including oesophago-gastro-duodenoscopy (OGD).

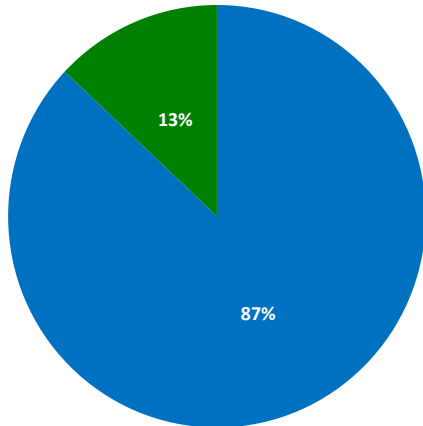

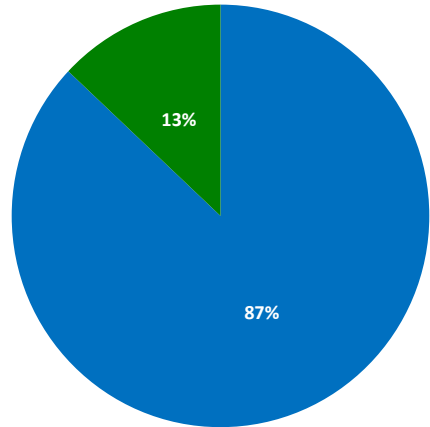

How would you rate the appropriateness of the topic to your career and/or studies?



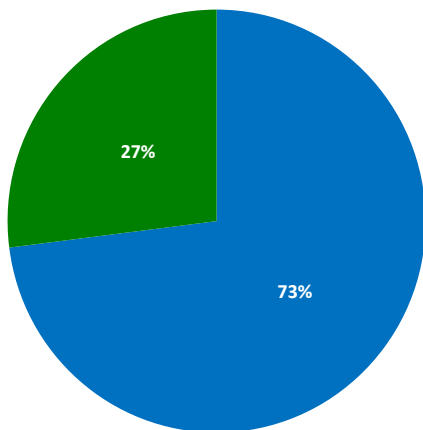

How would you rate the expertise of the speaker?



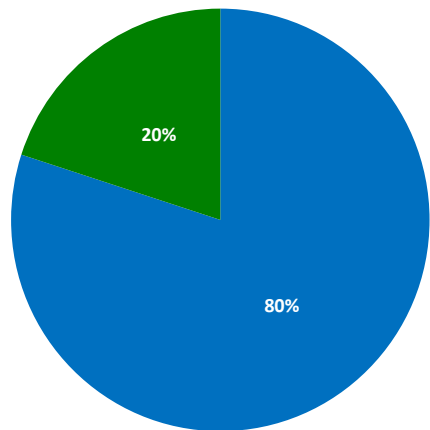

How would you rate the clarity of the information delivered?



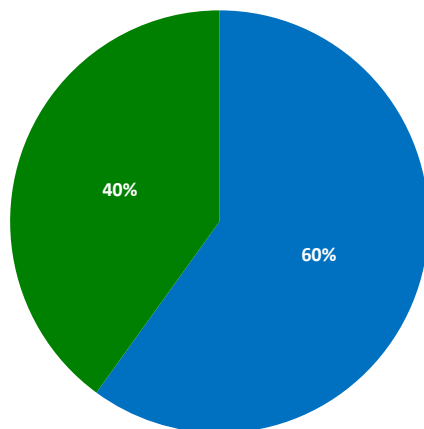
