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# National Undergraduate Conference for Anaesthetics and Critical Care Conference

The National Undergraduate Conference for Anaesthetics and Critical Care conference was aimed at undergraduate medical students with an interest in the specialties of anaesthetics and critical care. We aimed to allow students to gain insight into this field of medicine by inviting specialists to speak on a range of topics including anaesthetics, burns and emergencies, military prehospital medicine, as well as current training pathways.

The opportunity was available to submit a poster presentation with prizes awarded to the best overall projects.

Moreover, clinical skills stations, led by volunteer clinicians allowed students to develop an interest and practice their skills using specialised equipment.

Being the only undergraduate and critical care conference in Scotland, we were joined by students from Oxford, Manchester and Leicester last year, and hope to build further bridges with students from across the UK.


