The Wonder of Childhood (Part 1)

This lecture explored what makes paediatrics a unique, holistic and fulfilling speciality, as well as how early growth and development influence adult health. The talk focused on the first year of human life and the adaptations and challenges faced by the transition from life in the womb to the outside world. It also provided an overview and a structured approach to understanding common problems in infants and their presentations.

The talk was delivered by Dr M. Dandapani, who is a Consultant Paediatric Oncologist at the Queen's Medical Centre, Nottingham and Clinical Associate Professor at the University of Nottingham. With her clinical expertise in paediatric solid tumours and brain tumours, she leads the Children's Brain Tumour Research Centre in Nottingham, with a special interest in tumour metabolism, targeted therapies and biomarker identification.







How would you rate the expertise of the speaker?





How would you rate the clarity of the information delivered?




